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## Ask Here PA Software

- Question Point web-based software from OCLC
  - A complete reference management system, integrating chat, email, and chat widget (Qwidget)
  - Qwidget works with mobile devices
  - Texting with Upside Wireless or Mosio Text-a-Librarian
  - Public, Academic, Local Queues
  - 24/7 live help through membership in Reference Cooperative

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## Highlights of QP Software

- Policy pages
- Scripted messages
- Chat interface available in any language
- Instant messaging with other QP staff
- Ability to transfer active session
- Follow-up by participating libraries
- Statistical reports by librarian
- Statistical reports by institution

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### What Happens?

- 5 – 20 minute Chat conversation
- Provide information and/or show student how to find answers for future use.
- Staff tools =Your OPAC, Your library resources, POWER Library, Access PA, Your catalog, Credo Reference & the open web
- Follow-up

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### After the Session

- Student Completes Chat Survey
- Chat Transcripts reviewed for quality assurance by local Ask Here PA administrators and OCLC QP Quality Control
- Optional e-mail delivery of transcripts to students/patrons.

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## Ask Here PA Requirements

- Must staff 3 to 5 hours per week (this requirement is flexible)
  - 24/7 Academic Cooperative must be covered one hour per week by each participating academic library
  - Ask Here PA Public Queue must be covered one hour per week by each participating academic and public library

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## Your Students

- We love them!  
...but not all at once
- Limit simultaneous logons
  - Stagger logon times
  - Pair them up into groups
- We help with school related work and research, but...
  - We don't do "solve for x" or reading comprehension

**The Big Ideas:**  
Essential Understandings:

- Defining how to ask a question is key to effectively and efficiently researching the answer.
- Information for an academic project should be authoritative and reliable.
- Success in college depends on students being able to adequately define information needs and locate authoritative information in a timely and competent way.

**Essential Questions:**

- How do I narrow a topic?
- What do I need to know?
- What do I want to know?
- What do I know already?
- What reference help is available to me "after hours"?
- How do I use the help available to me?
